- 5) Not-for-Profit European Sport Events and Collaborative Partnerships in the field of sport

These information sessions will be held next Thursday, the 6th of February, starting at 2.00pm for local councils and at 4.00pm for NGOs.

Both sessions will be organised at the Ministry for Gozo, St Francis Square, Victoria.
