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The Compost Awareness Campaign, an EU funded project, draws to a close on 6 July

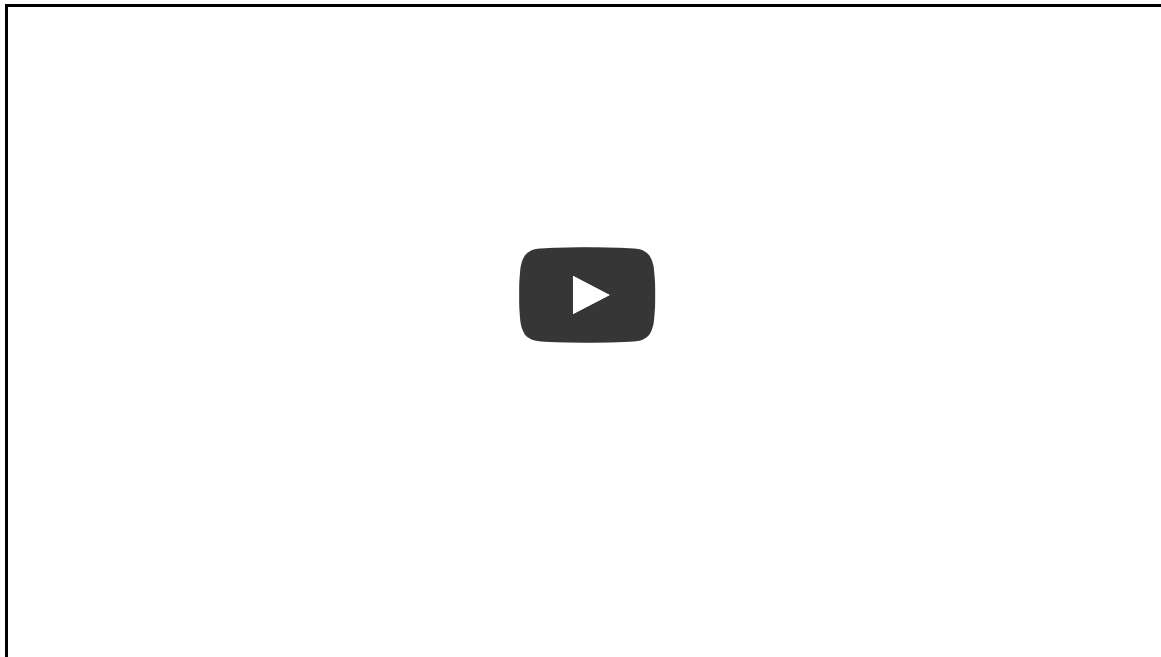
