

Expression of Interest for Trainers

Erasmus+ and European Solidarity Corps – Youth Sector

Deadline 18th May 2019

The EUPA is receiving applications from individuals (freelance basis) to form part of the pool of Trainers to conduct training sessions as part of the training cycle under the Erasmus+ and European Solidarity Corps – Youth Sector.

The main objective of the Trainers will be to assist the European Union Programmes Agency (EUPA) in the successful and effective execution of activities of the training cycles forming part of the Erasmus+ and European Solidarity Corps. The Trainers will be selected on the basis of their competence and proven experience in the formulation, delivery and evaluation of training-related activities specifically in the field of youth.

The successful applicants must satisfy these criteria during their engagement as Trainers:

- Understand the concepts and objectives of the Erasmus+ and European Solidarity Corps – Youth Sector and the need for provision of support and training to participants, mentors and organisations;
- Be competent in designing, implementing and evaluating training programmes;
- Able to deliver effective training sessions in non-formal set-up specifically for young people, youth workers and youth leaders;
- Be able to integrate diversity in the training sessions;
- Show tangible motivation to contribute to the improvement of the quality of training for participants on their arrival and mid-term of their experience in European Solidarity Corps;
- Be able to support the success of projects as well as positive and enriching experiences for all actors involved;
- Be willing to co-operate with EUPA staff and with international/local teams of trainers/facilitators;
- Be willing to actively participate in meetings and training organised by EUPA.

Shortlisted applicants shall be called for an interview.

Selection Criteria

Successful applicants are expected to demonstrate:

- Sound knowledge of the Erasmus+ and European Solidarity Corps – Youth Sector or previous EVS;
- Sound knowledge related to the support provisions for participants and organisations;
- Competence to design, implement and evaluate training programmes;
- How to integrate diversity in the training sessions;
- Competence to successfully conduct effective training sessions activities in a non-formal set-up specifically designed for young people.

Holding a recognised academic qualification at MQF level 6 or higher with a total of 180 ECTS/ECVET credits in Youth and Community Studies will be considered an asset.

Interested applicants are to submit the following at hr.eupa@gov.mt by latest 18/05/19:

- A motivation letter with supporting evidence of competencies and knowledge expected for this role;
- Curriculum Vitae in Europass format.

Deadline for submission of applications: 18th May 2019

The Agency will only consider candidates who:

- apply on an individual basis;
- fulfil the selection criteria;
- make themselves available to provide training to volunteers in accordance with the training dates established by EUPA (dates are usually established in Q1 of each calendar year).
